THDA Awards Home Repair Funds to Warren County

WARREN COUNTY, Tenn. (April 1, 2021) – Warren County has secured a \$500,000 HOME program grant from the Tennessee Housing Development Agency (THDA) to help local families with home repairs.

“This HOME grant will go a long way to help families in our community get the home repairs they need,” said County Executive Jimmy Haley. “I am thankful for THDA’s investment in Warren County.”

HOME program funding is intended to help families of low income, senior citizens, and individuals with disabilities who cannot afford to bring their homes up to code. Officials anticipate helping as many as 10 homeowners with issues such as leaking plumbing, unsafe flooring, faulty wiring, damaged roofs, and more.
